



# TACOMA LNG

**WHAT** Public Hearing on the Draft SEIS for the Tacoma LNG Facility

**WHEN** Tuesday October 30, 2018 from 2-5pm and 6:30-10pm

**WHERE** Rialto Theatre (310 South 9<sup>th</sup> Street, Tacoma)

The Puget Sound Clean Air Agency (PSCAA) has issued a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) that evaluates the air pollution impacts of the Tacoma LNG facility. We found the information in it alarming, and concluded that the LNG plant poses unacceptable risks to Tacoma. **Citizens for a Healthy Bay stands in opposition to the project and has asked PSCAA to update the SEIS, reissue it when it is complete and credible, and then re-open the public comment period.**

## TALKING POINTS

- ★ **I oppose the LNG facility because it poses unacceptable environmental risks.** The SEIS shows that greenhouse gas emissions will be worse than the status-quo if the LNG facility is built.
- ★ **The SEIS uses misleading and outdated information.** The SEIS only considers global warming impacts 100 years from now; a 20-year global warming model should have been used to more accurately reflect the true impact of the project. Additionally, the model uses outdated information from 2007. Using the latest science available is the only acceptable path forward for a complete SEIS.
- ★ **The SEIS ignores cumulative emissions sources.** The SEIS excludes any emissions sources that produce less than 1% of the total emissions from the project. These smaller emissions sources could add up to a large greenhouse gas impact, and need to be included in the SEIS for it to be valid.
- ★ **The SEIS is missing critical information.** There are significant data omissions in the SEIS. As it stands, it is missing crucial model information that accurately reflects how our climate will be impacted if the LNG facility is built.
- ★ **The SEIS makes unrealistic, unenforceable assumptions.** The conclusion of the SEIS rests on all of the gas supply coming from British Columbia. This cannot be enforced by PSCAA. Additionally, there is mounting evidence that fugitive emissions from BC wells and pipelines are much worse than reported.

- ★ Introduce yourself and the personal stake you have in this issue.
- ★ Write your comment in advance and practice with a timer.
- ★ Comments will be limited to three minutes, but may be shortened to two minutes if there is a big turnout of commenters.
